"Becoming passionately outward-focused for Jesus Christ." "We're still here." "We're still here!" Simple words that can be said in a discouraged way or with excitement and enthusiasm. Sometimes just moving the emphasis from one word to another can make all the difference. Leading a church during a pandemic was not something they prepared me for in seminary. My colleagues and I are all learning as we go. It involves a lot of prayer and asking God some hard questions. However, as I prayed, I've been drawn to the letters of Paul, especially those he wrote from a prison cell in Rome to the various churches he had visited. Although he was absent, he wanted be present with the churches, and he sought to bridge that distance. He offered his support and guidance through letters written to be read aloud in their gatherings. These letters offered hope to those gathered and helped them to look beyond their current situation to better days ahead. I've often found that hope in the letter to the Philippians, and although it was written nearly two thousand years ago, it seems so appropriate for our current situation. These writings of Paul will be the subject of our next sermon series: Present While Absent. In this six-week series we will take a closer look at how Paul found and offered encouragement without being physically present with his congregation, and we will consider what those words can mean to us now.

The Administrative Council met in late August and made the decision to continue with **online worship only** through September. We continue to consider the situation on a month-to-month basis, and we will meet again in September to consider the situation for October. Whatever we do, though, we know that God is with us.

So, for now, our online worship continues. You can find it on our website (www.wyandotteumc.com) and on our Facebook page (www.facebook.com/ WyandotteUMC/videos). One doesn't need to be a member of Facebook to access our page. I am particularly grateful for Fonda who pre-records the music, and even includes her son Andrew accompanying her on guitar and vocals. Written transcripts of the service are sent out on Tuesday or Wednesday of the week following each service by post or email. We will once again offer drive-through communion on Sunday, September 6, 11:00 AM – noon. This has been well received the last few months, and I look forward to seeing each person who comes.

I appreciate the way that folks have continued to support the church with their tithes and offerings. Although our costs of operation are reduced, they do still exist. Currently, our financial situation is sound, and there are reserves available if we need to tap them, however, that has not yet become necessary. Our food pantry continues to face high demand, and your donations of food to this ministry are greatly appreciated.

The building is still available for small groups to meet, provided they use fellowship hall and adhere to requirements for masks and social distancing. We only request that notification be provided to the office in advance of use so that we know who has been in the building. This is extremely important because if infection would occur, we need to be able to assist the county with contact tracing.

It's good to be able to see your faces when you come for communion. In the meantime, be well and be safe, and I will see you soon! Blessings,


