"Becoming passionately outward-focused for Jesus Christ." Do you ever wake up in the middle of the night with so much on your mind that you can't get back to sleep? It's been one of those weeks. But the nice thing about that time of night is the house is very quiet and there is very little traffic outside, and actually, it can be a good time to think. The beginning of a new year is often a time when we pause to reflect on our lives – where we've been and where we're headed. As I completed six decades of my life this past month, it has caused me to think about why I've done the things I've done. Forty some years ago, when I entered into an engineering career, one of the answers I often gave to the question "Why do you want to be an engineer?" was "I want to be engaged in a career where I have the opportunity to learn something new every day." When I went into ministry, the answer changed to "I want to be able to show people that God loves them on a daily basis." The funny thing is, though, that as time has gone on, I can say that each of those answers works for both careers. In my secular career as an engineer, I hope that those around me could see God at work in my life and know that God's love extended to all. As a pastor, I find that I still continue to learn new things every day.

One of those things that was brought home to me recently is the importance of sending cards and letters to those we don't see as often as we'd like. As I sat with a family planning a celebration of life, they told me how much their family member enjoyed receiving cards and letters and little notes. These small messages would be saved to be read over and over again, treasured reminders of friends and relationships that had faded over the years. I guess I knew this was important, but in the busy-ness of life, I think we sometimes can forget, and minimize our own influence in the lives of others. I want to urge you, when you think about someone you haven't seen in a while, take it as a nudge from the Holy Spirit to pause and drop that person a note or a card. It may brighten their day, and yours, as well.

As we look to the New Year here at Wyandotte UMC, our thoughts turn to moving forward in living into our mission of becoming more passionately outward-focused for Jesus Christ. We will have an opportunity to participate in the "Good Neighbor Experiment" training on January 22, 1-5 PM, sponsored by the Great Plains Health Ministry Fund. The goals of this "experiment" are to find better ways to express our faith in ways that genuinely care about our neighbors (and not just our church), to find ways to integrate our faith into our daily life and interactions rather than just when we attend something at church, to be a relational, abundant and joyful congregation, to see where the Spirit of God is moving and draw upon our congregation's strengths in order to follow it, and to energize our church members and strengthen our community. 

SUNDAY SCHOOL Two Adult Sunday School Classes are available




