Friends,

Is it March already?!? These first two months of 2022 have flown by.

With Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 2, often, in the past, I have opened the church at various times during the day when people can come by and receive the cross of ashes on their forehead or hand. This year, we are going to deviate from that ritual. Because of ongoing concerns about safety, I will be available in the sanctuary for the imposition of ashes from 4-5 PM on Wednesday, March 2 while the S.H.A.R.E. coloring group is gathered in the Fellowship Hall. The wooden doors on the north side of the building will remain locked, and you are invited to enter the building through the glass doors on the east. This way, anyone coming in will be seen by the people in S.H.A.R.E.

Also, with the beginning of Lent, the Women's Bible Study will be taking a break to allow them to participate in a Lenten Study I will be leading on Wednesday evenings from 6-7:30 PM on Jesus' last week of life on as a man. This is based on the book *The Last Week* by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan. I have preached using this book as a reference in the past, but there is so much more in it than I could cover in six or seven sermons, and we have a lot of new people that weren't here yet when I used it in the past. Each week of this study will include gathering for a meal, eating together, and taking a deep dive into the events of Jesus last week. It's not necessary to read the book, but if you would like to, it is available from Amazon and other retailers, and I do have a few extra copies available. We are planning this study to take place in Fellowship Hall with the exception of March 16, when we will be at The Dotte Spot. I hope you will consider joining us each Wednesday evening during Lent. I may be approaching some of you to help with meal preparations as well. It is B.Y.O.B. (Bring Your Own BIBLE)!

Our Lenten Sermon series "Windows on Easter" will invite us to contemplate the death and resurrection of Jesus through the different perspectives of eyewitnesses. Some will be more familiar, others less so, but each will have something to say to us. Just as we sing in the spiritual "Were You There?", we will consider what those who were there saw and heard and felt, that we might be able to learn what they learned. As we look at our Lord's passion through the windows of their various perspectives, may the grace and mercy of Christ grasp our hearts in ways that transform us deeply, like they transformed those who were there.

Finally, the outreach committee has once again chosen to support Mobility Worldwide through our Lenten and Easter offerings. We previously supported them at Christmas time in 2019. Mobility Worldwide reflects the love of God by bringing the gift of mobility and dignity to those in developing countries who are unable to walk. You'll learn more about this as we move through Lent. Each of the recipients of these vehicles have names, faces, families, hopes, and dreams. The Executive Director of Mobility Worldwide, Gary Moreau, will be joining us in the sanctuary during the Sunday school hour on March 27 to tell us more about the work they do. He has promised to bring one of the mobility carts along so we can each get a chance to try one out. Our Outreach Committee has set a goal of raising \$3500 in order to send 10 vehicles to places where the need is great. I hope you will join me in contributing toward this goal through the season of Lent.

Thank you all for your care and concern in the last few weeks. I'm feeling a little stronger each day, and I appreciate all the prayers and offers of help. Please be safe, and I'll see you soon!


