It's hard to believe that it's already October. September has flown by!

that we'll finally get a break from the heat of summer, and things begin to get really busy in life and around the church. It seems every week has something exciting going on. Here at Wyandotte, we begin a month-long series called "Your Actual Neighbor." As partners with the Good Neighbor Network and through a grant from the Kansas Health Foundation, a team of individuals from the congregation are participating in the Good Neighbor Experiment, to put into action tried and true practices for connecting with the people who live nearby. Most people intuitively understand that being a better neighbor is a good thing to do. Without much convincing, people agree that knowing the names of their neighbors would be helpful. However, neighboring is far more than just "helpful." Neighboring is a movement to reclaim our wholeness as human beings which includes connecting with others, keeping isolation at bay, bolstering public health, strengthening civic engagement, stimulating the economy, and transforming community based institutions. This is done by fostering long-term relationships, focusing on the gifts neighbors possess, and following joy toward authenticity. A good neighbor is defined as a person who intentionally develops relationships with the people living near them while focusing on giftedness, abundance, and joy. Community is essential for health and happiness and by embracing our gifts and the gifts of those around us we can live more fully into our authentic selves. 

The Crusaders Class is an adult Sunday school class that meets in the room just off Fellowship Hall. They participate in a number of different studies. This class also meets at 9:00 am.


Children's Sunday school available when children are present.


