It's hard to believe that it is August already. It seems that the older I get, the faster time goes by. Maybe it's because each day represents a smaller fraction of my entire life up to this point, and every new day makes that fraction even smaller. I've never been frightened by math, although I know it scares a lot of people, but when I consider that each day gets smaller, proportionally, it can be a cause for concern.

This month we will finish up our summer series, *The Path of Disciple-ship*. The first three Sundays of August we will consider the subtopic of *Searching for the Face of God*. Whether you call them "God-sightings" or "glory moments," being alert to the presence of God is a fundamental requirement for the disciple. Some might even argue that it is these discovery moments that keep us going on the pathway to discipleship. Whether you are just beginning to chart your disciplemaking path or you are well-versed in the ways to help church members become disciples, a vital reminder for all is that we are seeking the face of God in the world in which we live and work. At the same time, we begin to realize that for our neighbors and friends, we may become the face of God for them.

As the month ends, we will shift our focus to consider how we seem to be always beginning our journey of faith. Some may think, "We began long ago," and that could be true. Yet, each day is a new beginning, a reaffirmation of the desire to be a disciple of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Even though there are those of us who are more seasoned travelers on the journey of faith, we are constantly met with new disciples. Rather than being slowed down by this, we are rejuvenated by the zeal that new converts often bring with them. "The journey begins" then is a time of celebration and of hopefulness. So, here in the late summer and beginning of fall, when some things are winding down and other things are starting up, it is time for us to remember who we are and to whom we pledge our ultimate allegiance. Let's go back to our first love and embrace our God with passion and with joy.

Finally, speaking of things starting up, August brings the start of a new school year. Please remember to pray for the children, teachers, and other staff in the schools of our world, and especially within our community. Pray for their safety and learning, for their emotional and physical health, and that they may know love and understanding in and outside of school.


SUNDAY SCHOOL Two Adult Sunday School Classes are available

The Crusaders Class is an adult Sunday school class that meets in the room just off Fellowship Hall. They participate in a number of different studies. This class also meets at 9:00 am.


Children's Sunday school is available when children are present.




