May greetings! I hope this newsletter finds you well and enjoying all the gifts of God that surround us every day. It seems like spring has finally sprung. In just the last few weeks, we've gone from budding trees to a full-on explosion of green. Mowing has resumed and allergies are at a peak.

In worship this month, we will be continuing to look at Psalms and associated scriptures, leading up to and following Pentecost on May 19. Pentecost is a special day in the life of the church as it is considered the birthday of the church. It's also the one Sunday out of the year that we get to use the beautiful red paraments. That's what we call the cloth covings on the altar and pulpit, and the large bookmark in the altar Bible. Red symbolizes the color of fire to represent the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost and times when the work of the Holy Spirit is emphasized. During Holy Week it represents the blood of Christ. Red is also used for ordinations, church anniversaries, and civil observances such as Memorial Day and Thanksgiving. Here in Kansas City, we also include Super Bowl Sunday among those civil observances, just because we think we should. I want to encourage you to wear red on May 19 as Margo brings a message about Pentecost.

The reason Margo will be preaching on Pentecost is because Steve and I will be in Miami, Florida attending the graduation of our future daughter-in-law, Chancée Forrestier, from the University of Miami School of Medicine. She has accepted a residency position in obstetrics and gynecology in Saginaw, Michigan which will begin on July 1. She and our son Aaron will be moving there from Detroit in the next few weeks. 
SUNDAY SCHOOL Two Adult Sunday School Classes are available

Children's Sunday school is available when children are present.




