Merry Christmas!! Now you may try to tell me that Christmas is over, but Christmas – the Christmas season actually ends with Epiphany on January 6. The "Twelve Days of Christmas" of that infamous song are actually the ten days beginning with Christmas, December 25-January 5. On the church calendar, this season is still considered Christmas.

That being said, we will need to take down the decorations that grace our sanctuary and fellowship hall before we move into Ordinary Time. This has been scheduled for January 4, 2025 at 1:00 PM. Many hands make light work and we can accomplish this quickly if you can join us to help. With Epiphany, we begin a brief period of Ordinary Time called "Epiphany" in which we consider the life of Jesus as he began his ministry. Ordinary Time takes us up to Lent which begins with Ash Wednesday which falls on March 5 this year. As we begin this time of looking at Jesus' life, we move into a sermon series called: Re-Membering the Body. Although Advent and Christmas may have come and gone, the excitement continues. Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord maintain the joy and the promise. The church has an opportunity to be gathered, reoriented, and put back together -"Re-Membered." At times, holidays can be hectic and draining. As a community, we turn to one another and see the light of Christ among us. As individuals, we hear the voice that declares us children of God and feel that acceptance, knowing God is well-pleased with us. This Epiphany, you are invited to be "Re-membering the Body."

Following this, we will move into a series called "Where You Are: Embracing the Familiar." Ordinary Time is more than marking the weeks until the next big event. It is a way of walking with Jesus and growing into our faith as we are making and being made into disciples. This Ordinary Time, you are invited to look at where you are – as individuals and as a community. We want to do that in two parts. We begin with what is familiar, what we see every day, and what we do week by week—the familiar, and maybe the over -familiar. We need to look at what we've seen so much that we don't see it anymore. But we need to look; we need to see because this is where we are.

Thank you all for your Christmas gifts to me and the church staff. We had a great year, and I am continually astounded by the gracious generosity of this congregation! This generosity is also exhibited in your contributions to UMCOR for the wonderful work they do. I do not have a final tally, but as of the beginning of December, we had collected and sent \$2,870 to UMCOR. As of December 20, when this newsletter article was written, we have collected an additional \$745. December 22, Christmas Eve, and year-end donations have not yet been counted, so I expect that number to grow. And, of course, this doesn't include any contributions made online or mailed directly to UMCOR. Ruth Miller will have a final report at the January 12, 2025 worship service in the Moment for Mission, and I will report it here in the February Newsletter.

- All are welcome -Children's Sunday school is available when children are present.





Jerusalem! How often would I have sheltered you under my wings, as a hen does her chicks, but you would not have it so" (Luke 13:34)

On the 2nd day of Christmas my true love sent to me ... Two Turtle Doves

The Old and New Testaments, which together bear witness to God's self-revelation in history and the creation of a people to tell the Story of God to the world.

On the 3rd day of Christmas my true love sent to me ... Three French Hens

The Three Theological Virtues: 1) Faith, 2) Hope, and 3) Love (1 Corinthians 13:13)

On the 4th day of Christmas my true love sent to me ... Four Calling Birds

The Four Gospels: 1) Matthew, 2) Mark, 3) Luke, and 4) John, which proclaim the Good News of God's reconciliation of the world to Himself in Jesus Christ.

On the 5th day of Christmas my true love sent to me ... Five Gold Rings

The first Five Books of the Old Testament, known as the Torah or the Pentateuch: 1) Genesis, 2) Exodus, 3) Leviticus, 4) Numbers, and 5) Deuteronomy, which gives the history of humanity's sinful failure and God's response of grace in the creation of a people to be a light to the world.

On the 6th day of Christmas my true love sent to me ... Six Geese A-laying

The six days of creation that confesses God as Creator and Sustainer of the world (Genesis 1).

On the 7th day of Christmas my true love sent to me... Seven Swans A-swimming

The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: 1) prophecy, 2) ministry, 3) teaching, 4) exhortation, 5) giving, 6) leading, and 7) compassion (Romans 12:6-8; cf. 1 Corinthians 12:8-11)

On the 8th day of Christmas my true love sent to me ... Eight Maids A-milking

The eight Beatitudes: 1) Blessed are the poor in spirit, 2) those who mourn, 3) the meek, 4) those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, 5) the merciful, 6) the pure in heart, 7) the peacemakers, 8) those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake. (Matthew 5:3-10)

On the 9th day of Christmas my true love sent to me ... Nine Ladies Dancing

The nine Fruit of the Holy Spirit: 1) love, 2) joy, 3) peace, 4) patience, 5) kindness, 6) generosity, 7) faithfulness, 8) gentleness, and 9) self-control. (Galatians 5:22)

On the 10th day of Christmas my true love sent to me ... Ten Lords A-leaping

The ten commandments: 1) You shall have no other gods before me; 2) Do not make an idol; 3) Do not take God's name in vain; 4) Remember the Sabbath Day; 5) Honor your father and mother; 6) Do not murder; 7) Do not commit adultery; 8) Do not steal; 9) Do not bear false witness; 10) Do not covet. (Exodus 20:1-17)

On the 11th day of Christmas my true love sent to me ... Eleven Pipers Piping

The eleven Faithful Apostles: 1) Simon Peter, 2) Andrew, 3) James, 4) John, 5) Philip, 6) Bartholomew, 7) Matthew, 8) Thomas, 9) James bar Alphaeus, 10) Simon the Zealot, 11) Judas bar James. (Luke 6:14-16). The list does not include the twelfth disciple, Judas Iscariot who betrayed Jesus to the religious leaders and the Romans.

On the 12th day of Christmas my true love sent to me ... Twelve Drummers Drumming

The Twelve points of doctrine in the Apostles' Creed: 1) I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. 2) I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. 3) He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. 4) He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell [the grave]. 5) On the third day he rose again. 
